AMAZONIA

Amazon rainforest covers an area of more than 5 million square kilometers of which 80% is on Brazilian territory. Amazon corresponds to 41% of the European territory, less than half of this continent. It is the largest and most intact rainforest region in the world.

The **Katerre Expedition** began its operations in 2004, based on a desire to develop ecotourism expeditions in communion with the communities of Rio Negro. The company is headquartered in the municipality of Novo Airão, located 200 km from Manaus – the starting point for exploring the entire length of the lower and middle Rio Negro, either on regular monthly expeditions of 3 to 7 nights, or on customized trips (charter). Available all year round, the cruise offer a calendar with available dates. The shorter regular routes (3 nights) run through Anavilhanas – the 2nd largest river archipelago in the world –, and the longer ones (7 nights) go up the Negro River to the Jauaperi River, on the border with the state of Roraima.


With two boats built right there – from the local expertise of the naval industry of Novo Airão – the Jacaré-açu and the Jacaré-tinga are truly Amazonian in their design and essence. Made of hardwood and finished in natural fiber fabric, the boats convey warmth, as well as their appearance does not make them out of tune with their rough surroundings.

- **Jacaré-Açu Boat** has 8 suite cabins with air conditioning; meal room; a living room and cinema, with sofas and projector for films and; on the top floor, an open deck with a solarium and hammocks to relax and enjoy the views.
- **Jacaré-Tinga Boat (smaller)** has 3 cabins with air conditioning; dining room, and a deck with solarium.

The Cruises includes: Transfer Manaus-Novo Airão-Manaus, the cruise itself on its respective route with full board (including drinks: water, juice, beer and caipirinha), excursions with a bilingual guide (Portuguese/English), entrance to the Parks, Expedition map.

During navigation on Katerre expeditions, there is no internet connection, nor can you get the mobile phone signal from the operators. There is only one satellite phone used exclusively in emergencies, not available for use by visitors. The 4G signal is available near the municipality of Novo Airão.





Transfers

Expeditions depart from Novo Airão, except for the Anavilhanas and Anavilhanas-Jaú routes, which depart from Manaus, at the Tropical Hotel pier.

Itineraries

Anavilhanas (04 days / 03 nights)

The itinerary includes the highlights of the Manaus region, such as the Meeting of the Waters and a visit to an indigenous community. The boat ride along the Rio Negro to the Anavilhanas National Park - the second largest river archipelago in the world, with over 400 islands (the first is further up the Rio Negro, in the Mariuá archipelago). Enjoy the beauty of the Anavilhanas islands and their dense forests, which give way to white sand beaches bathed by the Rio Negro during the dry season. Includes: Meeting of the Waters, Visit to the indigenous community, Anavilhanas National Park and Almerinda Malaquias Foundation.

Jaú (05 days / 04 Nights)

This is the ideal route for those who have little time but want to explore the remote and preserved Amazon, sailing up the Rio Negro. The Jaú National Park is one of the largest conservation units in the world, declared a Cultural Heritage of Humanity. With rich biodiversity and giant trees, this protected and remote place is accessible only by river expeditions. Forest trails, water trails, creeks and igapós (in the rainy season) and river beaches in the dry season are the highlights of this expedition. Includes: Visit to the caboclo community, trails in the Madadá Caves, nighttime spotting, visit to Velho Airão and Anavilhanas National Park.

Jaú Plus (07 days / 06 Nights)

The largest freshwater forest park in the world still holds enigmas to be unraveled. Due to the relatively complicated logistics of access, its trails, waterfalls and creeks are little explored by tourists. Monkeys, sloths, dolphins, pacas and birds can be observed during overnight stays in the jungle, or from the river, close to sunset. In the dry season, giant otters are the highlight. Riverside communities, with genuine northern cultural manifestations, give a human touch to a region where nature still commands the show.

Anajaú (07 days / 06 Nights)

With a diverse range of wildlife and human attractions, this itinerary offers diving with Pink Dolphins, interaction with Tuiuka Indians and sailing through different ecosystems - from the Solimões River, with its muddy waters, to the Anavilhanas National Park, where the mirror-like waters of the Rio Negro reflect the stunning landscape. At its most distant point, we will visit the Jaú River, home to the largest freshwater forest park in the world. Riverside communities, with genuine northern cultural expressions, give a human touch to a region where nature still commands the show.



Itineraries

Jauaperi Reserve (08 days / 07 nights)


If among all the attractions that the Amazon has to offer your greatest desire is to contemplate wildlife, this is the itinerary for you. Despite beaches that appear during the dry season, villages with exquisite crafts and charming waterfalls, the Jauaperi River is the untouched home of some of the most stunning species of Amazonian fauna - giant otters, manatees, jabiru, coatipur, tree monkeys, huge black caimans, flocks of red toucans, solitary spotted hawks and outrageous multicolored macaws.

Notes:

1. The Combo tours include the attractions of the 2 tours that comprise it, in 2 fewer days, configuring a better cost/benefit ratio, since the first and last days of the expeditions are the same. For example: AnaJaú Combo, includes the Anavilhanas National Park tour, with the surroundings of Manaus, going up the Rio Negro and continuing with the Jaú National Park tour;
2. In addition to the main tours described, we operate on a charter basis, the following tours:
3. Jaú-Extreme (8 days/7 nights), Rio Branco (9 days/8 nights), Alto-Médio Negro (9 days/8 nights), Serras Guerreiras de Tapuruquara (9 days/8 nights) and Serra do Aracá (10 days/9 nights). Check availability of vessels.
4. The itineraries are arranged chronologically according to the flood and dry seasons of the Rio Negro, optimizing the available attractions as much as possible, whose availability varies greatly according to the river level. Therefore, some itineraries are only available during the flood season, and others only during the dry season. For charters, we recommend that this factor be taken into account.

Flood Season: April to August

Dry Season: September to March





Gastronomy Services

All packages include breakfast, lunch, snacks during the tours and dinner, beverages: water, juice, soft drinks, beer and caipirinha.

Projects and Sustainability

Katerre is also the maintainer of an environmental project to recover the Amazonian tortoise population, an endangered species of chelonian, a consequence of illegal hunting and the fragility of monitoring and surveillance in the APA (environmental protection areas) in the region. The family of freshwater chelonians consists of 16 species, of which 4 lay eggs on beaches (iaça, irapuca, tracajá and turtle) – these are the most endangered.

- All Katerre Expedition vessels are built from managed hardwood, in the regional style and using local artisanal shipbuilding techniques, offering top-quality onboard service, on an all-inclusive basis, including alcoholic beverages from our menu (beers and caipirinhas);
- We emphasize that our rates are based on the fair value policy and are the composition of the Amazon's mobile river logistics, fuel costs, maintenance program, specialized crew, top-quality food, tours, attractions and all the infrastructure necessary for a smooth and safe trip;
- The company reserves the right to make changes to the itinerary presented according to the river level or navigation conditions that may interfere with the proposed activity.

The cruise includes: Transfer Manaus-Novo Airão-Manaus, the cruise itself on its respective route with full board (including drinks: water, juice, beer and caipirinha), excursions with bilingual guide (Portuguese/English), entrances to the Parks, Map of the expedition and video documentary mp4.

Boarding/Disembarkation: Boarding and disembarkation takes place in the municipality of Novo Airão, 180km away from Manaus by paved road. However, this transfer, in an air-conditioned vehicle, is included in the package and will take place on the morning of the day of departure (between 8:30 am and 9 am), as well as, soon after disembarking, transfer back to Manaus (Hotel or Airport), with estimated arrival in Manaus (between 3pm and 5pm).

The routes Anavilhanas, Anavilhanas and Jaú + Anavilhanas and Apuaú depart from the port of the Hotel Tropical Executive.



Important Information

Vaccines

- Yellow Fever vaccine is not mandatory but we recommend that all passengers take the yellow fever vaccine, including children, at least 10 days before your arrival date for the trip.

The vaccine is valid for 10 years, so you can take it in advance. No proof of vaccination against yellow fever is required.

Health / Travel Insurance

- We highly recommend that you have health and travel insurance for the Belo Shabono expedition.

Checklist

All year round, the weather in the Amazon is hot and wet, with cooler nights. During the Belo Shabono expedition, you don't need to worry about mosquitoes due to the Negro River's acid waters. However, we recommend that you put on insect repellent when you go for a hike in the forest, and also during the other activities on land. Be sure to bring comfortable clothing and shoes with you. You can find a checklist suggestion below with the main recommended items:

- There is little to none available phone signal during the expedition. Be prepared to be offline most of the time;
- There is electricity (110v) on the boat, which means you can charge your electronics;
- There is also a place on the boat where you can hang your clothes to dry, in case they get wet during an activity;
- Shower towels and bed linen are provided during the expedition.

Food Service & Staff

Adventure Cruise: 4 Days & 3 Nights (Cueiras)

Day 1 / Manaus – Embarkation – Rio Negro – Meeting of Waters – Indigenous Community Visit

Arriving on a flight the day before, our host will meet you at your hotel at 9 am. Enjoy a panoramic city tour of downtown Manaus and transfer to Manaus port for embarkation. Settle into your suite as you embark on one of life's greatest adventures. After an introduction to our naturalist guides and a routine safety drill, join us on the covered open top deck for the first of many Amazonian cuisine experiences. We'll start with a welcome lunch at the phenomenon of the Meeting of Waters and then visit an indigenous community.

Day 2 / Anavilhanas National Park – Cuieiras River – Jungle Walk – Canoeing

Begin the day with birdwatching along the Rio Negro. Sail upstream to the Rio Cuieiras region, an Anavilhanas Archipelago tributary. Take a motorized canoe excursion to spot wildlife like parrots, hawks, monkeys, and sloths. Conclude with a wildlife excursion and stargazing at night.

Day 3 / Acajatuba Lake – Riverine Village Visit – Biking – Stand Up Paddling





Suggested Clothing

During the rainforest summer the average temperature in the Amazon region is about 40°C, although sometimes it may feel lower because of the wind chill factor. For this reason, it is best to wear one layer of light, breathable clothing. The suggested clothing for Rio Negro is: synthetic and cotton t-shirts (short and long sleeve), rain cover, lightweight, waterproof and breathable, washand-wear long zip-off pants, bathing suit, waterproof hiking boots or sturdy shoes, socks, torch/ flashlight (headlamp) with extra batteries, day backpack (40lt or less), one-liter water bottle, sun screen: SPF 70 minimum, insect repellent, personal first aid kit (simple and light - analgesic, disinfectant, antibiotic).

You will also need a hat, a scarf, waterproof sturdy shoes or boots, and sunglasses with high UV protection. We also suggest packing comfortable rubber-soled shoes, sandals or flip flops for walking around on the outside decks.

Photography

To see the wildlife, you should have a good pair of lightweight binoculars (the suggested magnification is 7x or 8x). If you are passionate about photography, do not forget a good zoom lens to shoot wildlife while avoiding close approaches. Also, pack a good supply of memory cards and spare batteries. The recreational use of drones is not allowed in Rio Negro.



All of the cabins on the Motor Yacht Tucano are outside cabins with large windows, private baths with showers, and air-conditioning. There are three categories of cabins. The vessel has a capacity of 18 travelers in double occupancy in all nine cabins.

Yellow Category Cabins: The five double cabins in this category are large and have beds side by side. They are numbered 3, 4, 5, 6, 0. Cabin "0" has a queen size bed and a single bed.

Green Category Cabins: The double cabins, #2 and #7, have above and below berths with single size mattresses. They are smaller than the Yellow cabins, but are comfortable outside cabins with large windows, private bathrooms, and air-conditioning.

Blue Category (Single Cabins): These single cabins, numbers 1 and 8, have a single twin bed. On request, these can be converted to Green cabins. Queen Beds, Convertible: The Yellow Category beds can be converted into queen sized beds.

Single Occupancy: If a single traveler is willing to share with another same gender passenger, he or she will be charged the Green Category rate, even if a roommate is not available. Voyage to the Heart of the Amazon: 7 days and 6 nights


Voyage to the Heart of the Amazon is different from all other cruises offered in the Amazon. It is an “expedition cruise”. We go far into the forest and are able to see creatures that are hidden to other visitors.

Day 1: Early this morning all guests board the vessel the Motor Yacht Tucano and depart upstream on the Rio Negro. Through the morning we will cruise through the world’s largest river island system, the Anavilhanas Archipelago. From the observation deck we scan the magnificent tangle of vegetation at the water’s edge. By mid-afternoon the vessel has gone beyond the frontier of settlement and entered a wilderness area. Both shores are covered by dense rainforest. Though we cannot predict what we will see, we have a good chance of observing pink river dolphins and a large collection of exotic birds. Most certainly we will be treated to magnificent forest vistas and the spectacular trees themselves. In the late afternoon we embark in the launches and hunt for wildlife. We may also go for a swim in some of the world’s most clean and refreshing water. (LD)

Day 2: Early this morning we explore the rainforest along the waters edge in our launches or kayaks, each group with a naturalist guide. We should hear and perhaps see howler monkeys and we should hear a morning serenade of toucans. After breakfast we go for a walk in the forest where we will get a good start on understanding Amazon ecology. Around midday we return for lunch and the vessel will get underway, perhaps stopping at a place to swim. In the late afternoon we will again explore the forest in our launches and listen to the sunset chorus of birds and frogs. (BLD)

Day 3: This morning there will be an early exploration of the waking forest. We will keep our eyes open for monkeys... on most trips we see them often. We return for breakfast followed by either a walk in the forest or an excursion in the launches. M/Y Tucano will travel during the middle of the day and we stop in the afternoon for an excursion. Tonight the vessel may travel a bit more as we marvel at the night sky crowded with stars. (BLD)

Day 4: After our two morning excursions The M/Y Tucano will navigate along the heavily forested shore, scouting for wildlife. We may stop for a visit at a settler’s home carved out of the forest. In the early afternoon we will be near an extraordinary river called the Rio Jauaperi. Here we will see a kind of forest known as the varzea. We will scout along the shoreline for some of the extraordinary creatures found only in this unique environment. Weather permitting we will have a night excursion to observe nocturnal creatures. (BLD)



Day 5: Today we will voyage to the west side of the Rio Negro and continue to scout in our launches and walk in the forest. We will explore according to the weather and water depth areas rarely visited by anyone else. Tonight the M/Y Tucano goes downstream and rive depth permitting, will enter an east bank affluent of the Rio Negro and explore on deep into the rainforest on this small river. After our nocturnal exploration of the rainforest in our launches and we return to the Motor Yacht Tucano for “Caipirinha Night” on and perhaps try a bit of samba on the top deck. (BLD)

Day 6: We begin the day with a dawn excursion hunting for wakening wildlife followed by a full Brazilian breakfast. We will then go one last time into the forest. In the mid-afternoon we will begin to journey downstream to arrive late in the day at the “Encontra das Aguas” a stark several mile long line where two of the world’s largest rivers, the Amazon and the Rio Negro join in a turbulent maelstrom. Here the dark water of the Negro runs beside the opaque brown water of the Amazon. At sunset the M/Y Tucano will once again turn her bows upstream on the Rio Negro and journey to our overnight anchorage north of the City of Manaus. As we pass in front of Manaus, we will marvel at the scale of one of the world’s largest and most vibrant port cities, that is over one thousand miles from the sea. Into the Wild Amazon Cruise: 5 days and 4 nights

On the Amazon Odyssey we not only focus on the rainforest, but also on the culture of the people who live in this vast wilderness. We visit small fishing villages perched on the river bank where the traditional life is still guided by the rhythms of the rise and fall of the river. We also visit the homesteads of families who make and grow almost everything they need. For many travelers these visits with local settlers, whose lives are so dramatically different from ours, are some of the most memorable experiences of the cruise.

Day 1: This afternoon we embark on the Motor Yacht Tucano in Manaus, Brasil. We depart on the Rio Negro and as the vessel glides upstream we will have our first talk about Amazon environments. By late afternoon we enter one of the world's largest river island systems, the Anavilhanas Archipelago. The boat will weave along a winding channel with rainforest on both sides in a riot of brilliant vegetation. Weather permitting, we will go for a launch excursion in the gnarled and dense flooded forest known as the igapó. Along the river bank we may see some Squirrel Monkeys and we may hear the other-worldly growls of Howler Monkeys echoing through the primitive rainforest. The Amazon has one of the greatest collection of birds in the world and we are sure to see some of these brightly colored jewels perched in the treetops. We return to the M/Y Tucano for hors d'oeuvres on the observation deck and a toast to the rainforest sunset. Following dinner we will embark in our launches in search of nocturnal creatures such as the Caiman, the Amazon's crocodilians. We may also see one of the large night birds such as a Potoo with its bulging eyes and large mouth adapted to swallow the huge Mariposa Moths. (D)

Day 2: Shortly after sunrise this morning we explore the Anavilhanas Archipelago, a reserve that includes the world's largest system of river islands and also areas of tall dense rainforest. Here we will see the strange environment called the igapó, the black water flooded forest where dense forests grow right out of the dark water of the Rio Negro. Mid morning we return to the vessel for a hearty Brazilian breakfast. After some time to relax, weather permitting we will disembark at mid-morning and will go for a walk in the type of rainforest known as the terra firme. Here we have a good chance to see the markings, if not the animals themselves, of some of the Amazon's great mammals like peccaries (wild pigs) or even a jaguar. Around mid-day return to the vessel for lunch and a siesta. In the afternoon we will excursion in our launches along the edges of the dense forest and listen to the sunset chorus of birds, howler monkeys, and frogs. Weather permitting, tonight we will have an excursion to spot caiman (the Amazon's crocodiles) and other nocturnal creatures. We very often see arboreal porcupines or sloths scrambling high in the limbs. (BLD)

Day 3: Today we will voyage to the west side of the Rio Negro and continue to scout in our launches and walk in the forest. We will explore according to the weather and water depth areas rarely visited by anyone else. Tonight the M/Y Tucano goes downstream and river depth permitting, will enter an east bank affluent of the Rio Negro and explore on deep into the rainforest on this small river. After our nocturnal exploration of the rainforest in our launches and we return to the Motor Yacht Tucano for "Caipirinha Night" on and perhaps try a bit of samba on the top deck. (BLD)



Day 4: We begin the day with a dawn excursion hunting for wakening wildlife followed by a full Brazilian breakfast. We will then go one last time into the forest. Degree of Difficulty: Good health is necessary. Most guests can have a quite enjoyable trip by simply staying on board the M/Y Tucano and participating in launch excursions. Participants in our walks in the forest must be able to comfortably walk for two or more hours at a time.




MV Desafio

M/V Desafio (which in English means "Challenge") is a great 34-meter three-masted sailing ship, it provides the highest standard service available in the Amazon Region.

M/V Desafio depart from Manaus, capital of the State of Amazonas, a city in the jungle that prospered during the rubber boom last century. This is a four-day cruise visiting the Anavilhanas Archipelago, the largest river archipelago in the world, and its igarapés (permanent river channels) and igapós (non-permanent river channels). Due to its acid waters, endemic mosquitoes are practically inexistent. The cruise also includes daily explorations and activities in safe motorized boats into the jungle, as well as a rich Amazonian cuisine served in the panoramic restaurant.

DAY 1: Manaus / Tres Bocas - Anavilhanas

Boarding from 1:30 PM. Departure at 2:00 PM. We will be welcomed with a “caipirinha”, followed by an introduction to the crew and an explanation of safety procedures by the captain. The guide will explain the trip itinerary. Cold lunch served during the navigation towards the "Meeting of the Waters". Navigation to Tres Bocas – Anavilhanas. Dinner on board. Departure shortly after for a reconnaissance tour and possible caiman sighting. Overnight stay.

DAY 2: Anavilhanas Archipelago

Early in the morning, before breakfast, at 6:00 AM, departure in canoes to witness the awakening of the jungle and the singing of the birds. Return for breakfast on board. Departure in canoes for a jungle walk, accompanied by a local guide(caboclo), who will explain the medicinal uses of the plants, with the possibility of spotting birds and some animals. Visit at flourmill house, where the process for planting for use is explained. We will have the opportunity to eat fresh “tapioca”. Return for breakfast onboard. Continue navigating to the floating dock to observe pink dolphins and “pirarucu” fish. Navigate to the Paran do Ariau to contemplate the dense jungle and possibly spot monkeys. Continue by canoe to the meeting point at the mouth of the Ariau River. Lunch onboard. In the afternoon, piranha fishing and a night tour. Dinner onboard. Overnight stay.

DAY 3: Acajatuba Lake

Breakfast onboard. 3-hour navigation through the interior of the Anavilhanas Islands to the IBAMA station. Informative talk about their role in the Amazon, we will have the opportunity to see caimans, and then we will continue sailing towards the Tatuio tribe. Lunch onboard. Arrival and visit to the Tatuio indigenous village to learn about their habits and customs. Return to the boat and sail to Tup Beach or Jacar Ubau Beach, depending on the river level. Dinner onboard. Overnight stay.

DAY 4: Manaus

Breakfast onboard. Sail back to the port in Manaus, with estimated arrival at 11:00 a.m. Disembarkation.

The itinerary may change without prior notice, depending on weather conditions, while maintaining a similar program.

Sustainability

First green ship in the Amazon

The Untamed Amazon is partially powered by solar electricity and has state-of-the-art water treatment, fuel-efficient engines that comply with strict US and international environmental standards. A true feat of green engineering to guarantee that our ecological footprint is kept to a minimum.

Solar energy

Pioneers in the Amazon in the use of solar energy to supply the boat's electrical network, partially replacing diesel generation. The system of solar panels, lithium batteries and inverters is the most advanced in photovoltaic generation technology. The reduction in carbon dioxide emissions is equivalent to planting one tree a day.

Water treatment

The river water is treated by three filtration processes (including reverse osmosis) plus three purification processes (chlorination, UV light and ozone) and distributed pure and potable in the boat.

The sewage is treated in biodigesters and transforms the residual water that after chlorination returns cleanly to the river.

Non-plastic

Cruise has eliminated the use of plastic water bottles on board since 2018. In partnership with YETI, you can use reusable containers that we offer at the mothership.

Weather

Water

Through our partnership with YETI coolers, we've eliminated plastic bottles at Rio Marié by installing state-of-the-art filtration systems. The Untamed Amazon uses a five-stage process (sediment, micro, bacterial, and reverse osmosis filters) to provide safe, potable water. Quality is regularly tested by a certified Manaus laboratory, and bathrooms have filtered water in taps and showers.

Electricity

The Untamed Amazon runs on solar power with 24-hour electricity, supported by diesel backup generators. From 5 pm to 11 pm, generators recharge batteries for peak use; from 11 pm to 6 am, power comes from solar panels and battery banks. Voltage is 110V/50Hz. We kindly ask guests to save energy by switching off lights and devices when not in use.


Floor Plan





Porto Jofre Jaguars

Jaguars (*Panthera onca*) a feline in the *Panthera* genus, are the only extant *Panthera* species native to the Americas. The jaguar is the third-largest feline after the tiger and the lion, and the largest in the Americas. The jaguar's range extends from Southwestern United States and Mexico across much of Central America and south to Paraguay and northern Argentina. However, the only place you can really see them in the wild is in the Porto Jofre Region of the Brazilian Pantanal.

The Jaguars are best seen during the dry season, between mid June and the beginning of November.

The Mutum Expeditions boat is a new travel product, offering lodging and excursions to see the Jaguars in the Wild along the Cuiabá river banks, about 30 minutes far away Porto Jofre (boat ride).


